
# **Bailey Timeline & Milestones**

## John Bailey

1815	John Bailey born
1832	Goes into business; works with Cocker & Higgings (Salford), then Sharp, Roberts & Co. (Manchester)
1838	William H. Bailey born
1857	John Bailey sets up business in Albion Works, Oldfield Road, manufacturing a range of turret clocks After completing school, William Bailey becomes an apprentice

## **William Bailey**

1867 1874 1880 1884	John Bailey retires, hands control to William Bailey Business now manufacturing steam pumps, ram pumps, regulating valves, pyrometers, barometers, fire engines, tide recorders, gas jet motors, lubricators & turnstiles. Alfred Bailey (son of William Bailey) born William Bailey becomes a Salford councillor William Bailey is made an alderman John Bailey dies aged 69
1885 1889 1890 1894	Premises purchased at Hall Bank, Patricroft Incorporated as a limited company Alfred Bailey joins company William Bailey, now Mayor of Salford, knighted by Queen Victoria
1909	Albion Works now an imposing Salford landmark

1913	Sir William Bailey dies – obituaries remember him as "Manchester's most versatile citizen"
	Company's name changed to Sir WH Bailey & Co Ltd
1914	Patricroft site expanded
1918	Alfred Bailey becomes Governing Director
	Frederick Bailey (2 <sup>nd</sup> son of William Bailey) becomes Managing Director
1932	Donald Bailey (son of Frederick Bailey) joins company
1940	Alfred Bailey dies, Frederick Bailey becomes Chairman
	Company claims to make the greatest variety of machines in the world, until
	Albion Works site is destroyed during wartime raids
1941	Full production recommenced at Patricroft site
1943	Frederick Bailey dies
	Denis Bailey (son of Alfred Bailey) becomes Chairman
1946	Donald Bailey becomes Managing Director
1964	E. Morris Jones becomes Managing Director

## Yorkshire Imperial Metals Ltd


1966	Company purchased by Yorkshire Imperial Metals Ltd
1967	Merged with Whites Nunan Ltd; head office transferred to their premises at Sharp
	Street, Walkden. Patricroft site retained as a foundry and manufacturing site
1968	Dukes & Briggs Engineering Co (Trafford Park), suppliers of flow indicators,
	purchased – all work transferred to Sharp St
1969	William Ross & Sons Ltd (Glasgow) purchased – all work transferred to Sharp St
1970	Elliott & Garrood Ltd (Beccles, Suffolk) purchased.


#### IMI Ltd

1971	Sir WH Bailey & Co Ltd becomes direct subsidiary of IMI Ltd Product line rationalised over the next 10 years to concentrate on pressure reducing valves, safety & relief valves, stop valves, parallel slide valves, gas valves, fire equipment & castings
1978	Company's name changed to IMI Bailey Valves Ltd Samuel Birkett Ltd purchased
1981	Merged Bailey & Birkett Company's name changed to IMI Bailey Birkett Ltd
